NURSING 1-2-1 PROGRAM - MATC

Credits required: 70 for Associate Degree in Nursing (ADN) 28 for Bachelor of Science in Nursing (BSN)

Note: This is a four-year program in which students complete the pre-requisite courses at Mount Mary University (MMU), the ADN at MATC, and the BSN degree at MMU. Specific admission criteria apply. Some additional pre-requisites may be required depending on student's entry level. For example, CHE 113 is a pre-requisite for BIO 325, and MAT 105 or 109 is a pre- or co-requisite for CHE 113. To remain in good standing in the program, a grade of C or better is required for all courses, except those noted below. *Students must meet MATC's most recent required courses and other pre-requisites, regardless of the Mount Mary University catalog in which they began.
