COPYRIGHT IS

a bundle of rights within copyright law afforded the author or creator.



THESE INCLUDE THE RIGHTS TO

- reproduce
- distribute
- create derivative works
- perform or display the work
- authorize others to do any of these things

PLAGIARISM IS

passing off other's ideas as your own. Find many great tools to combat plagiarism in our Citing Your Sources Guide.



FAIR USE IS

one limit to authors' rights. It offers educators some use of protected materials without having to ask the copyright holder or ask permission. It allows for:
criticism and comment | reporting
teaching | scholarship and research

4 FACTORS OF FAIR USE

- purpose of the use
- nature of the work
- amount of the portion used
- potential value of the work
