Note: Students complete the University core requirements and Occupational Therapy (OT) prerequisites in the first three undergraduate years. Students must have 102 credits earned in order to start the BS/MS program. Specific grade requirements must be met in prerequisite courses to be eligible for admission. If accepted to the OT graduate program, students begin the first year of the BS/MS graduate program in their senior year. A Bachelor of Science Degree is awarded following the successful completion of two semesters in the BS/MS program (26 credits). A grade of B or higher is required for all OCT courses for retention in the major. See OT Admission Policy for more details on academic requirements for admission.
